We know that on Easter morning Jesus arose, the stone was rolled back, and the tomb was discovered to be empty.

Like winter, Lent can be an emotionally draining time. But we endure. We trudge through winter looking forward because we know the warmth and brightness of spring is ahead. And when spring arrives we appreciate it all the more because of winter. We journey through Lent to be reminded of

our sin and the price of our sin. We journey through Lent looking forward to Easter and the journey makes us appreciate Easter all the more because of our Lenten travels and travails. Lift up your head and look forward to the celebration of Easter.

Mission 50: New Mission to Support NARROW GATE HORSE RANCH

7535 W 00 NS, Kokomo, IN 46901

Narrow Gate Horse Ranch (NGHR) has recently been added to our list of Mission 50 giving. I'm Angie Mast, a member of Zion

Church and am on the Board, a volunteer, and facilitator at Narrow Gate. Here's a little bit about what you will be supporting with your monetary gift(s).

Narrow Gate Horse Ranch has classes for kids and uses Equine Assisted Learning with our lessons. The kids that come to the "ranch" are usually from low-income families and include those that are hard to reach, outcasts, and have behavioral or emotional difficulties. Others have unstable home environments and struggle in school. Many_of our students are from the Garden Gate apartments that Kokomo Urban Outreach used to serve. We've had groups from Kinsey Youth Facility and Bridges Outreach as well. The students range from 4-19 years. While participating in the classes, students learn soft skills such as responsibility, teamwork, leadership, and coping skills. During the lessons they are taught about God and the love He has for each student.

The students have classroom time, lesson/activity time, and then a closing time in the classroom to journal and pray. Sometimes they complete a chore such as scooping poop, picking up walnuts, etc.

Students have to go through 2- six weeks sessions with only missing 1 time before they can move on to the horsemanship classes that include putting on a saddle, bridle, and riding.

The classes are all free to the students and we have 50+ volunteers that help in various ways. Some lead classes, others clean the classrooms or

are greeters. There are many ways to be involved. The costs of running the program include feed and healthcare of the horses, maintenance of the arena and grounds, and other costs associated with a place like this. This is not a cheap operation, and every dollar is spent wisely and with the thought of how to best help students. We can always use more volunteers, so ask us how we can put your gifts and talents to work. We have a prayer group that meets at the ranch every Monday at 1 p.m. to pray for the program and students. Some even join the prayer time via a Google meet if they can't make it out there at that time.
