This past weekend was Memorial Day. It is a day on which we as a nation remember those who have died in military service of our nation. There are several different days of observance on which we recognize our military forces. Some of them are distinct days for each branch, some are for specific medal winners, some are for war related consequences (ie PTSD awareness) and some are for military families. There are three that I want to briefly point out. The first is Armed Forces Day, celebrated on the third Saturday of May. This day is to recognize those who are currently serving in the armed forces. Memorial Day is to remember those who died while in active service to our nation. These are usually those who have died in war. Veterans Day, November 11, is to recognize those who have served and have been discharged in good standing. While we don't have perfect comparisons there are some parallels to the church. On All Saints Sunday, first Sunday in November, we remember those who have died in the faith, focusing on the past year, and gone on to be a part of the church victorious, much like Memorial Day. Much like Armed Forces Day, the celebration of Holy Communion is a celebration of all those of the Lord's Army, still in the fight. What about Veteran's Unlike the military there is no discharge in good standing for the Lord's Army. If you get out it Dav? is not with good standing and conversely if you are in good standing you are still in the fight because there is no retirement this side of the church victorious. I have heard it said that Jesus has a great retirement plan, but you have to die to receive its full benefits. As Memorial Day is still large in our rear-view mirror, take a moment and remember those who have died in the faith. The writer of Hebrews calls them our cloud of witnesses. In particular, remember those who had an impact on your faith and give God thanks for those faithful saints of the Lord. Looking out the front windshield also give thanks for those who currently serve alongside you, your battle companions, as we war against the devil's false kingdom waiting for final retirement. Put on the full armor of God, Ephesians 6:10-18.

Zion's 2024 Henderson Work Camp is the week of June 9th. 23 participants will be leaving right after worship to travel to Frakes, Kentucky. This year we will be converting 112 fixtures to LED lighting in the Mission Dorm on campus. In addition, in a home with a 45-year-old man who lives with his 18-yearold nephew and his 21-year-old brother we will be painting a living room and their kitchen. We will also be painting the front and rear deck for a 62-year-old woman.

Another project we will work on is a 12 x 16 room addition for a 76-year-old woman who is raising her grandchildren ages 16, 15, and 11.

Please pray for these families and Zion's work team that we can demonstrate Christ's love to them and can share Christ in word and deed. Please also pray for the safety of our team.

We also have started collecting boxes of articles to take with us. We already have four boxes of new shoes, shirts, and women's undergarments. Zion is awesome with their giving!


