The theme may be easy, but the details are complicated for me. I fear what exactly to write. It is not that I don't like, respect, love or admire moms. This also does not mean that I do not want to honor moms. I am just always constantly torn by seeking to maintain a balance between sensitivity for those who may not have had a caring/loving/nurturing mom and those that did. I also do not want to create a picture of the perfectly impossible Biblical mother that no mother can achieve and thus create feelings of inadequacy in a multitude of mothers. So I struggle.

I know these things. (1) **We all had a mom**. This is a fact of nature and is indisputable. You were not picked up at Wal-Mart. (2) Since you did not come from Wal-Mart **you did not come with an instruction manual**. (3) Since you did not come from a department store, this means that **you could not be returned** when you did not function perfectly, i.e. woke up at all hours of the night wanting food, was colicky, cried without notice or explanation, was not satisfied with any means of trying to resolve the unexplained tears, would instantly awaken when placed in your baby bed and

would only sleep while mom walked the floor, bouncing you in her arms, (your mother may at this time inform you of any other behavioral imperfections you might have displayed), which forced mom to learn by trial and error. This yields the unavoidable reality, (4) **Moms are not perfect**. Virtually all of them know this harsh reality already. They know it without you telling them.

This means you have the right to love, honor, give grace and pray for them all the more. This is a good and right thing to do, and it is what God said you should do. To all the moms out there, thank you and have a Happy Mother's Day. May God's blessings be upon you.

This year's work camp is getting closer! We have 22 people signed up and many good projects to work on. One half of the \$350 registration fee was due April 1st, and the balance is due on or before May 19th. We are going to have a logistical planning meeting on May 5th after worship service in the Beamer Room at Zion. We have a great group going and I am so looking forward to a wonderful time! Thank you to all who have signed up! Our project total cost is \$7,495 and we have already received \$7,100. So, we only need an additional \$395 to complete all the projects we have planned. A BIG THANK YOU to Zion for your wonderful support! We will be taking a small trailer for our tools and any donations you would like to make. You can go online to www.hendersonsettlement.com and then click on "Needs List" and then click on "shop our Amazon Needs List" This will show you the items they are in need of and if you do shop online they will shipped directly to Henderson Settlement. This year we would like to support their MIHOW (Maternal Infant Health Outreach Worker) program. The MIHOW program works with expectant mothers and their children through the age of three. Some examples of items needed include Huggies, special baby bottles, baby socks and clothing, soothies, onesies, bibs, and many other things. Also, if you like to crochet, you could make baby blankets, baby hats, etc. We are asking that anything new or gently used you donate be placed in a small U-Haul box. These are inexpensive boxes, and it makes for easier hauling and delivering to Henderson, and they appreciate the boxes as well. I will have boxes available at the welcome center. We will leave right after worship service on Sunday June 9th and plan to arrive at Henderson Settlement by 6 pm in time for dinner. The trip is 368 miles and takes 5 ½ hours if you don't stop on the way. Earlier I did send an email to all work campers with information on what to bring, insurance and many other things. SEWING FOR MISSIONS

For several years, Kevin and I have been sewing articles for Midwest Mission, an organization that provides humanitarian and disaster relief worldwide. We originally became connected to this organization when we made school supply bags instead of exchanging gifts at our family Christmas for Operation Classroom

for UMCOR. We were looking at a closer drop-off site than Sager Brown distribution center in Louisiana and discovered Midwest Mission Storehouse. We have been sewing a variety of different projects for Midwest Mission since that time that includes cloth diapers, school bags, quilts, washable feminine hygiene pads, infant gowns, receiving blankets, and children's clothing. It allows us to be involved in a "serve-at-home" mission ministry. When my mom passed away, I inherited a closet full of her fabric collection (my mom had little self-control when it came to fabric!), and it has kept me busy for guite some time! As I have been sewing this spring, God has planted in my heart that there may be others who have, as my mom called it, her "sometime" closet - the closet for projects to do "sometime". The sewing projects are simple sews – no difficult techniques, and many require little amounts of fabric and are great for using up scraps. So – if you are one of those folks – please let me know if you might be interested in a monthly "SAWS" - Sew Along With Sheila session. I envision a short time of devotion together, and a great time of sewing and fellowship. I'll provide the patterns and instructions as well as a list of supplies/fabrics needed for each session. If there is interest, it would be *really cool* to take a group to deliver our projects and allow others to tour their facility and see first hand all that they do. Sewing projects are just one area of service - they do meal kits, school desks (made from old bleachers), a bicycle ministry, cleaning kits, and a long list of other things. If you would like to be involved in this sewing ministry, please contact me at mamalamb27@gmail.com or talk with me at church. You may be saying, "but I don't sew". I realize not everyone does – but can you cut with scissors? Can you lift and press with an iron? Can you handle a pair of pliers to set snaps? Even Mom Lamb, at 95 clips threads for me and helps package finished products. And Kevin – well, he is the *master* of their quilt pattern! So, yes – if you'd like to be involved, women, men (yes, roosters are allowed in the henhouse for this project!), kids and teens -- we can find a job for you. I look forward to hearing from some of you and see where this seed that God has planted in my heart goes!

on the 25th at 10:00 AM. Come to the kitchen doors and join us in the Beamer Room. Questions? Contact Cindy Einselen


