Valentine's day is upon us. Much has been written about the commercialization of the day and it being created by greeting card companies for profit. Valentine's day is older than greeting card companies although its origins are somewhat vague. There are those who believe that it was originally a Roman festival, Lupercalia, held in mid-February. The festival, which celebrated the coming of spring, included fertility rites and the pairing off of women with men by lottery. At the end of the 5th century, Pope Gelasius I forbid the celebration of Lupercalia and is sometimes attributed with replacing it with St. Valentine's Day.

There are a number of martyrdom stories associated with various Saint Valentines connected to February 14, including an account of the imprisonment of Saint Valentine of Rome for ministering to Christians persecuted under the Roman Empire in the third century. According to an early tradition, Saint Valentine restored sight to the blind daughter of his jailer whom he had befriended and, by some accounts, even loved. An 18th-century embellishment to the legend claims he wrote the jailer's daughter a letter signed "Your Valentine" as a farewell before his execution. There are numerous additions to the legend have better related it to the theme of love: one tradition maintains that Saint Valentine performed weddings for Christian soldiers who were forbidden to marry by the Roman emperor; to spare the husbands from war.

There is an 8th-century notation which recorded the celebration of the Feast of Saint Valentine on February 14. The day became associated with romantic love in the 14th and 15th centuries, when notions of courtly love flourished, apparently by association with the "lovebirds" of early spring. In 18th-century England, it grew into an occasion for couples to express their love for each other by presenting flowers, offering confectionery, and sending greeting cards, known as "valentines".

Regardless of its origins it is clear that the church had a hand in the creation of or the background to Valentine's day, Also, regardless of its origins, it has become a day associated with love in general and romantic love in particular. It is fitting then for the church to spend some time contemplating love during this month. Perhaps it is doing something specifically romantic for the one who makes your heart go "pitterpatter" or feel like it is pumping peanut butter. Perhaps it is something you do for family or friends who are especially dear to you. But Jesus reminds us in Luke 6:33-35 that our love is not to be only for those who love us back, "33 And if you do good to those who are good to you, what credit is that to you? Even sinners do that. 34 And if you lend to those from whom you expect repayment, what credit is that to you? Even sinners lend to sinners, expecting to be repaid in full. 35 But love your enemies, do good to them, and lend to them without expecting to get anything back. Then your reward will be great, and you will be children of the Most High, because he is kind to the ungrateful and wicked." So, as the world hurtles toward flowers, chocolate and diamonds in an attempt to express their love for one another, let us ask how we can love those who cannot or will not love us back. How can we love the homeless? How can we love the poor? How can we love the addict? How can we love the mean and angry? Perhaps it is by doing walk a mile or by serving at the food pantry or by giving away blankets or rain coats or buying a meal for someone or Let our love be greater than what we have considered before.




